TYPES OF ASSIGNMENTS

In-Class Assignments-

These assignments will vary.

Quizzes- Short quizzes will occur throughout the unit. They will always be announced in advance. This will help you know what material you need the most help with and also tell you what you have mastered. (F)

Unit Tests- At the end of each unit we complete there will be a test. These tests will consist of multiple choice questions, short answer, and essay questions. (S)

Research Projects- You will be assigned various projects throughout the semester. Some projects will be completed in-class only, some will need to be completed independently. (F, S)

B.Y.O.T. (BRING YOUR OWN TECH)

LATE WORK

MAKING UP MISSING ASSIGNMENTS

Students with excused absences will need to meet with me to get missing assignments and schedule make-up tests and quizzes.

All students will be given a deadline to make-up missing quizzes and tests. This policy does not apply to students that skipped class on the day of a quiz or test.

RETAKES

If you fail a summative assessment you will be given the opportunity to retake that assessment. In order to be eligible for a retake you will be required to complete a retake assignment. If you do not meet the deadline for the retake assignment you lose the opportunity to retake the failed assessment.

Honors students wishing to retake a summative assessment will still still be required to complete a retake assignment. The highest grade they will receive on a retake is 70%.
